82 new girls are being trafficked into sexual slavery every day

- More than 200,000 persons were believed to be trafficked into, within, or through the country annually; 15 percent of the country's estimated 2.3 million prostitutes were children, while the U.N. reported that an estimated 40 percent were below 18 years of age.
- [200,000 trafficked annually / 40% (avg % of minors) = 30,000 girls trafficked annually = 82 girls trafficked per day]
